Plot of the Movie

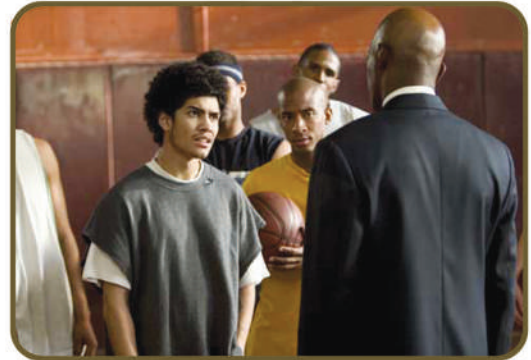
